School-wide Evaluation Tool (SET)

Research-validated instrument to assess and evaluate the critical features of school-wide PBIS across an academic school year. The SET helps to determine (1) the extent to which schools are already using SW-PBIS, (2) if training and technical assistance efforts result in change when using SW-PBIS, and (3) if use of SW-PBIS procedures is related to valued changes in the safety, social culture and violent behavior in schools.

WHO: District coach or Regional TAC conducts brief interviews with building administrator, 10 staff members, and 15 students in each building

WHEN: Annually (Winter)

HOW: Review of records, interviews, observation

TIME: 1 - 2 hours



Benchmarks of Quality (BoQ)

The BoQ measures the degree to which a school is implementing the universal level of SW-PBIS. The results of the BoQ are used to (1) evaluate the extent to which schools are implementing SW-PBIS; (2) identify potential model schools; (3) provide a mechanism for school teams to identify areas of strength and weakness; (4) guide the district and state project in providing training and technical assistance; and (5) evaluate outcomes relative to level of implementation.

WHO: Building PBIS team completes Team Member Rating Form; Internal/External coach or Regional TAC completes Scoring Form

WHEN: Annually (Winter)

HOW: At a PBIS team meeting

TIME: 20 - 30 minutes for initial completion
1 - 2 hours for review and action planning

Self-Assessment Survey (SAS)

Examines the current status and need for improvement of four behavior support systems: (1) school-wide discipline systems, (2) non-classroom management systems, (3) classroom management systems and (4) individual student systems.

WHO: All building faculty and staff

WHEN: Annually (Spring)

TIME: 20-30 minutes

Team Implementation Checklist (TIC)

Guides the development, implementation, monitoring and revision process for building a positive school-wide culture. It helps to sustain efforts across time as well as through administrative and staff changes.

WHO: Building PBIS team

WHEN: Monthly or quarterly or annually through Initial Implementation Phase

TIME: 20-30 minutes

School Safety Survey (SSS)

Evaluates the extent to which a school provides a safe learning environment, training and support needs related to school safety and violence prevention; a school's response to violence and the effectiveness of protective measures

WHO: A minimum of 5 staff members of pre-determined roles

WHEN: Annually (Spring)
