April is **Literacy Month** at Heritage. Kicking off the month, HEA hosted an **Author Visit and Workshop**. Additionally, HEA is sponsoring a spring **Buy-One-Get-One-Free Book Fair** and the ever-popular **Classroom Door-Decorating Contest!** Thank you HEA for these wonderful literacy events.

Music is filling the April air. The **Spring Choir/Bell Concert** will be held on April
7. The students are working very hard
to prepare for a beautiful patriotic
concert for all. Thank you to Mrs. Mata
for the energy and dedication to our
Heritage music program. Additionally,
Mrs. Orlando will be hosting the first
ever **Heritage Art Show** prior to the
concert. I know this will become a new
tradition! What an awesome opportunity
to showcase our budding artists.

Our spring break produced a spring blizzard, which did delay the completion of the Metro District ball field renovation. As the field dries from the much-needed moisture, the renovation will be completed. As noted last month, no school district dollars were spent on the renovation. The project was 100% funded by Metro District dollars.

Our budget process has been completed for the 2009-10 year. The March 19<sup>th</sup> letter from our Director, Ginny Owen, outlined the feeder budget reduction plan. To summarize the plan, below are the changes that will take place at Heritage beginning next school year:

- Our school will maintain an elementary band/orchestra program embedded during the school day, however, the program will be offered to 6<sup>th</sup> grade students only. This holds true for all elementary schools in our feeder.
- Our feeder will continue to offer the

facilitator of gifted and talented position at each elementary school at a reduced level. The gifted and talented facilitation role will be expanded to the middle school to support a smoother transition at the secondary level.

- Our feeder will continue to support the roll out of elementary world language through the use of technology. All Mountain Vista feeder elementary schools, including Heritage, will be offering Spanish through technology. Details for implementation at each school are in process.
- Literacy intervention will be the focus for our schools, which was a top priority on the district survey. At Heritage, we are designing programming to enhance early literacy support for our students.
- The English as a Second Language (ESL) programming will continue. All elementary schools in the feeder will have an ESL program to identify and serve our English Language Learners.
- At Heritage, due to reduced funding, we have eliminated science as a "specials" offering. Science content will be taught in the regular classroom, which is what we have done in the past prior to having science as a special. All students will still have "specials" in art, music, physical education, technology and library.

Thank you to all who participated in the feedback process for supporting the feeder plans. Enjoy the spring weather and I will look forward to seeing you at one of our many

upcoming activities.

In March, the HEA Board approved the following:

- A grant for \$1,191.78 to Mary Lams to purchase and install a flat screen television. The television, which will be located in the front office, will display current events and announcements at Heritage. Kids will learn how to use PowerPoint to create and display presentations on the television.
- A grant for \$313.74 for P.E. teacher Shawn Larkin to purchase materials that will be used for each class to create their own vinyl flag that will be used during Field Day, and then in the classroom.



# Spring Assessment Day Information By Andrea Cosens, 4th Grade

On Wednesday, April 15<sup>th</sup> students and teachers at Heritage will meet in small groups to spend time reading, writing or participating in math assessments together. A few reminders about our day:

- Students will come to school for their assigned time block only.
- ▶ Kindergarteners have 45 minutes blocks; 1<sup>st</sup> through 6<sup>th</sup> graders have 90 minute blocks.

- Students do not need to bring backpacks, snacks or water bottles to school that day.

evening as the **Pajama Night** literacy event.




